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As researchers and authors in fields that include higher education, immigration, migration, comparative studies, and sociology of education, we are very pleased to invite you to submit chapter proposals for our new book, “Migrants, Refugees and Global Challenges in Higher Education”. This volume will be published in the textbook series, *Higher Education Theory, Policy, and Praxis*, Dr. Virginia Stead (Series Editor), Peter Lang Publishing, New York, NY.

The book will provide a forum for scholars who conduct research with a focus on immigration and higher education. It is prompted by the growing increase in migrant student movement due to globalization, economic or ethnic discrimination, wars, and natural disasters. These student migrants, refugees, and foreigners strive to realize their equal and just right to higher education in the host states where they are relocated or absorbed. This volume will discuss application of the values of equality, fairness, power, identity, and multi-culturalism that filter the access of migrant, refugee, and foreign students into higher education programs. The authors will address these issues at the theoretical, policy, and practical levels. Furthermore, their research will describe how HE institutions confront issues of equity and equality in their efforts to offer higher education to immigrants, refugees, and displaced students. These issues consist of challenges such as integration into a foreign culture with unfamiliar teaching-learning methods and the crisis of finance for their studies and living expenses. We invite you to contribute a chapter proposal according to these guidelines.

The chapters may take one of two approaches: empirical investigation or conceptual argument/review. At this stage, we would welcome a brief structured abstract of your chapter (max 250 words in WORD .doc or .docx) including the research question/argument, value, methods, findings/lines of review, arguments, and discussion **using APA format**.
