

Call for Applications for New Editor of *Qualitative Psychology*

We are pleased to announce a call for a new Editor-in-Chief of *Qualitative Psychology*, the journal of Section 3 (*Society for Qualitative Inquiry in Psychology*) of Division 5 (Division for Quantitative and Qualitative Methods).

Qualitative Psychology provides a forum for innovative methodological, theoretical, and empirical work that advances qualitative inquiry in psychology. The Journal publishes articles that underscore the distinctive contributions that qualitative research can make to the advancement of psychological knowledge. Studies published in this Journal often focus on substantive topics, while also highlighting issues of epistemology, the philosophy of science, methodological criteria, or other matters bearing upon the formulation, execution, and interpretation of qualitative research.

We are especially interested in candidates for the position who are:

- _engaged in or have experience in doing research within the field of qualitative approaches
- _engaged in activities within Section 3 (SQIP) of Division 5 and are or are willing to become a member of SQIP
- _supportive of and able to work closely with associate editors and potential authors to uphold high standards for research and publication while also encouraging dissemination of the important work that psychologists do in public settings
- _known for their positive professional reputation and standing among others in the field
- _employed in a work environment supportive of this type of editorial work

We are looking for an editor with:

- _previous editorial or associate editorial experience or evidence of editing and writing ability
- _experience in book and/or journal editing
- _experience in managing the editorial process, such as being an associate editor, special issue editor, and/or reviewer for multiple journals.
- _excellent communication skills and the ability to work cooperatively and constructively with others
- _good management skills, including managing a budget, meeting deadlines, and filing reports

The incoming editor will overlap with the current editor in the transition period, be supported by the current associate editorial staff, and receive a modest stipend.

Michael Bamberg, PhD, will chair the search. Applicants from historically underrepresented groups are encouraged.

Applicants should submit their application to Michael Bamberg at mbamberg@clarku.edu. The application should include a) a current CV and list of relevant publications, and b) a letter articulating:

- _a guiding philosophy for the mission of the journal
- _a vision for the future of the journal, especially in the digital future
- _a plan for ensuring the journal represents diverse authors and scholarship, including openness to scholarship critical of dominant systems
- _experience and/or skills in seeking contributions from researchers and clinicians engaged in public service psychology
- _editorial experience and skills

Review of applications will begin September 15th and continue until the position is filled.
